

Anticipated Crops

This document provides a preview of plants we anticipate becoming available later in the growing season. We generally aim for these crops to be ready by early summer (around July), though timing can vary and availability is not guaranteed. We recommend reaching out in late June for the most current updates on specific plants.

Broadleaf Evergreens

Buxus microphylla - Littleleaf Boxwood - Zone 5 - Full Sun-Part Shade - Japan, Taiwan

A compact species of this valuable group of evergreen shrubs. Plants are native to Japan where they can obtain heights of 10-12' in the wild. Under cultivation or with management, plants stay much more compact. As with all boxwood, plants are extremely durable and tolerant to pruning which makes them a leading candidate for hedging and foundation plantings. They offer high resistance to deer browse and will grow in both full sun and shadier locales. - 10-12' Tall and Wide

var. japonica 'Morris Midget' - A petite, garden-worthy boxwood developing a dense, mounded 18" high and wide form in many seasons. Excellent for low hedging or small formal borders. Foliage is medium green throughout the growing season and picks up faint plum-bronze hues in cool weather. - 1-2' Tall and Wide - #2 \$59.99

Ilex opaca - American Holly - Zone 5 - Full Sun-Shade - Eastern and Central North America

An attractive, slow growing evergreen tree reaching 30' at maturity. Native to shaded woodlands throughout much of the eastern United States. Many female selections offer a wonderful fruit display when grown in close proximity to a male pollinator. - 20-30' Tall, 10' Wide

'Pride Yellow' - A female selection of *Ilex opaca* from the late Orlando Pride with excellent cold hardiness and bountiful crops of canary-yellow fruit. The strong growing plants develop a classic conical framework of dense branching cloaked with rich green foliage. Rate of growth and mature size are expected to be similar to the straight species. - 20-30' Tall, 10' Wide - #2 \$49.99

NEW Ilex perado ssp. platyphylla - Canary Island Holly - Zone 7 - Part Shade - Canary Islands, Madeira

An elegant evergreen holly known for its broad, glossy, deep-green leaves that create a lush, refined appearance year-round. This subspecies forms a dense, upright shrub or small tree, making it an excellent choice for structured hedging or ornamental focal points. In late autumn to winter, it produces attractive red berries that add seasonal color and support wildlife. Plants are largely untested from a hardiness perspective in our climate so part shade with protection from wind exposure is advised. - 20-30' Tall (Guess) - #2 \$49.99

Conifers

Abies balsamea - Balsam Fir - Zone 3 - Full Sun - North America

A common evergreen species found throughout much of Canada and adjacent regions in the northern United States. These classic Christmas trees are also valued by wildlife for food and nesting resources. The deep green needles are fragrant and attractive all gardening season. Plants perform best in sunny locations in average to well-drained soils. In Connecticut, care should be taken to avoid excessive stress from heat and humidity. - 30-40' Tall

'Tyler's Blue' - A large growing form of balsam fir with attractive powder blue foliage. Typical vigor and growth form of the species. - 30-40' Tall - #2 \$49.99

Abies koreana - Korean Fir - Zone 3 - Full Sun - Korea

An outstanding small stature fir that is suitable for most any garden. The beautiful, soft textured foliage creates a striking contrast with its dark green surface and ghostly-white backing. Added interest is provided by beautiful, violet-purple cones which begin to appear when plants are as short as 5' tall. - 20-30' Tall

'Aurea' - A superb form of Korean fir with eye-catching gold-topped needles that contrast brilliantly with the bright purple cones. Plants form a well manicured upright habit and brighten the garden all year. - 15-20' Tall - #2 \$49.99

'Blauer Pfiff' - A choice, distinctive Korean fir grown for its tidy, low mounded form and handsome coloration. Each spreading, densely branched stem cloaks itself with silver backed, blue-green needles capable of adding clever contrast and pleasure to the garden throughout the year. Upright purple cones provide additional beauty during summer months. - 3' Tall, 4' Wide - #2 \$59.99

Abies veitchii - Veitch Fir - Zone 3 - Full Sun - Japan

The Veitch's fir is an elegant conifer native to the high mountains of Japan most valued for its soft, flattened needles and striking silvery-white undersides. The foliage creates a luminous effect, especially when stirred by wind, and contrasts beautifully with the tree's narrow, upright form. Slow to moderate in growth, it develops into a graceful specimen well suited to northeastern US climates. Exceptionally cold hardy and tolerant of snow load, it brings refined structure and year-round beauty to the landscape. - 40-60' Tall

NEW 'Gedreht' - A distinctive silver fir noted for its subtly twisted needles and cool blue-green coloration. The compact, upright habit and fine texture give it a refined presence in the landscape. Cold hardy and slow growing, it offers year-round interest with a quietly quirky charm. - 10' Tall, 4' Wide (Guess) - #2 \$59.99

Cedrus atlantica - Atlas Cedar - Zone 5 - Full Sun - Algeria, Morocco

A massive tree native to the wilds of Algeria and Morocco where majestic specimens reaching as much as 120' in height and breadth reside. Plants showcase attractive foliage that is arranged in whorls along the stems. Although wild forms typically have green foliage, most landscape specimens have been selected for waxy, blue-cast needles. Weeping, dwarf and upright cultivars are available and valued for specimen use in the garden. Plants have notable tolerance to hot, dry conditions and as a result can be utilized nicely in seaside plantings. The large specimen that resides on the south lawn of the White House is certainly a fine example of the qualities this species possesses. - 80' Tall and Wide

'Sapphire Nymph' - A choice Atlas cedar sporting eye-popping creamy new growth that matures to handsome tones of steel-blue. Plants have a dwarf, irregular growth form and tend to develop a narrow, upright structure. Ultimate size is still unknown yet we see plants gaining around 4-6" annually. - 15-20' Tall (Guess) - #2 \$49.99

Cedrus brevifolia - Cyprian Cedar - Zone 6 - Full Sun - Cyprus

A stately species often listed as *Cedrus libani* var. *brevifolia* though the trees mature shorter than classic *C. libani* with shorter needles and smaller cones. The ornamentally attractive cones appear at a younger age on *C. brevifolia* than on *C. libani* and the stiff, dark green needles and pebbly gray bark lend a formal, dignified air to the landscape. Native to the mountains of Cyprus, full sun and good drainage are both a must for best performance. - 30-40' Tall

'Kenwith' - A truly miniature conifer with a sculpture-esque, curvy, upright habit. Very short, dark green needles lend a fine-textured, almost felted look that will certainly make you stop and stare. - 3' Tall, 2' Wide -

Chamaecyparis obtusa - Hinoki Cypress - Zone 5 - Full Sun-Part Shade - Japan, Taiwan

A highly variable tree or shrub with soft, dark green foliage and peeling reddish-brown bark. The true species is rarely cultivated and of little significance to the nursery trade. Fortunately (or unfortunately) a startling number of cultivars are available. Most can be utilized as a specimen, companion plant, or addition to the rock garden. Plants perform best in moist, well-drained soil in full sun. Many forms are also surprisingly adaptable to part shade. - 30-50' Tall

'Melody' - A beautiful conifer that hits all the right notes with lacy, lemon yellow sprays that pick up burnished bronze tones during winter. The shorter, upright habit gives it the versatility to play the lead in small gardens or harmonize in a larger landscape or border. - 6-8' Tall, 4-5' Wide - #2 \$39.99

Chamaecyparis pisifera - Sawara False Cypress - Zone 3 - Full Sun-Part Shade - Japan

A narrow, pyramidal tree with an open branch structure. Displays light green foliage and excellent reddish-brown bark that peels off in long strips. Plants are at their best in well-drained soils in full sun. That said, many of the green and blue forms are happy in high canopy shade as well. The species is native to Japan where the rot resistant wood is used in the construction of palaces, temples and shrines. - 30-40' Tall

NEW 'Silver Lode' - A compact, eye-catcher with finely textured foliage that glimmers like it's auditioning for a beauty contest. Its dense, mounding habit adds softness and contrast to borders, rock gardens, or any spot that could use a little plant drama. - 3-4' Tall and Wide - #2 \$39.99

Microbiota decussata - Russian Arborvitae - Zone 3 - Full Sun-Part Shade - Russia

A wonderful, low-growing groundcover with rich green summer foliage that turns purple-brown in winter. Plants grow best in well-drained soils in full sun but will also tolerate part shade. They make great companion plants and are a welcome change from many of the more common needled groundcovers. - 1' Tall, 6' Wide

'Carnival' - This is a plant that knows how to party with colorfully splashed sprays of golden-yellow boldly dotted throughout the foliage. Like the species, the green branches will pick up coppery purple tones in the winter months before drifting right back to party mode in spring. - 1' Tall, 6' Wide - #2 \$49.99 • #3 \$69.99

Picea abies - Norway Spruce - Zone 3 - Full Sun - Northern and Central Europe

A large pyramidal spruce used frequently by landscapers and also valued by foresters for timber products. Plants are very fast growing and have wonderful dark green foliage. They generally develop into upright conical plants with somewhat drooping secondary and tertiary branches. Plants are happy in well-drained, sunny locations and are deer resistant to boot. - 50-60' Tall

'Acrocona'- A unique, moderate growing form that develops an irregular habit with arching branch tips. In spring, prominent, 3-4", red cones are present at the very tips of the branches. The cones emerge upright, but soon begin to droop as they mature and take on a more typical tan coloration. Found in the late 1800's near Uppsala, Sweden. - 15' Tall - #2 \$49.99

Picea koyamae - Koyama Spruce - Zone 5 - Full Sun - Japan

Koyama spruce is a rare and elegant conifer native to the mountains of Japan, where it thrives in cool, well-drained soils and often grows in rocky slopes. Valued for its narrow, pyramidal form and striking blue-green needles, it is ideal for gardens of all sizes, rockeries, or as a standout specimen. Preferring full sun, plants require little maintenance and once established bring quiet sophistication and a touch of Japanese elegance to the landscape. - 50-75' Tall

NEW **'Bedgebury Blue'**- A rare spruce prized for its stunning steel-blue needles and natural form. Plants promise to build into striking, low-maintenance specimen with year-round color and architectural elegance. - 20-30' Tall, 10' Wide (Guess) - #2 \$49.99

Picea omorika - Serbian Spruce - Zone 4 - Full Sun - Southeastern Europe

A noble, deer resistant conifer developing a narrow framework of upturned branches cloaked with rich green and silver bi-colored needles. Plants make attractive specimens and are equally as impressive when grouped en masse. The species and its cultivars are tough plants and are adaptable to a range of growing conditions including soils with high pH. - 30-50' Tall

'Pimoko'- A fine German selection that is one step down in size from 'Nana'. Plants form a low 1'x 2' spreading mound of gleaming green and silver needles over a 10 year period. - 1' Tall, 2' Wide - #2 \$59.99

NEW **'Wodan'**- A striking, narrow, mounding form sporting dark green needles tipped in silvery blue. Its elegant, pyramidal habit makes it perfect for small gardens, tight spaces, or anywhere you want a dramatic, attention-grabbing accent that doesn't hog space or give attitude. - 3' Tall and Wide - #2 \$49.99

Picea pungens - Colorado Spruce - Zone 3 - Full Sun - Western North America

An attractive, deer resistant spruce native to the Rocky Mountains from Wyoming to New Mexico. Older plants in the wild can rise to 100 or 120' in height. Landscape specimens are generally smaller in stature, obtaining 40-50' in time. The sharp needles are variable in color, ranging from silvery-blue to forest-green. Plants grow best in full sun in well-drained soils. - 40-50' Tall

'Spring Blast'- A fabulous new spruce that has everything going for it! In spring the initial flush will knock your socks off as it emerges hot shades of creamy-white. The show lasts for up to 6 weeks and is truly dazzling, especially when set off by the pewter-blue older foliage. Plants are consistent garden performers assuming a "classic" Christmas tree form. - 15' Tall, 8' Wide - #2 \$59.99

Pinus mugo - Mugo Pine - Zone 2 - Full Sun - Central and Southern Europe

A European pine that assumes an assortment of growth forms across its native range from 12" miniatures to immense 50' sprawling specimens. All cloak themselves with medium length, bright green needles held in groups of two. Several selections are abused like comfort food by some landscapers who insist on sticking a few in every gas station, bank and convenience store planting from here to Alaska. This is a true testament to the species' adaptability as they require little more than rays of sun and a free draining soil. Although several forms are grossly overplanted, a number of other selections are quite unique and worthy of consideration. - Irregular

'Laarheide'- A chameleon-like mugo pine with colors that ebb and flow from soft green to vibrant gold with temperature shifts during the year. During the warmer months plants maintain foliage tones on the green side of the spectrum. As cold weather comes in to play, the switch to gold is triggered as if someone asked for the lights to be turned on! A very special plant for adding a dose of warm foliage tones at a time when the garden is starved for it the most. - 3' Tall, 5' Wide - #2 \$59.99

Pinus parviflora - Japanese White Pine - Zone 5 - Full Sun - Japan

A highly variable pine native to many regions of Japan. The soft needles are bluish-green and clustered in groups of five. Bark is generally smooth and gray-green in color. Plants assume a flat-topped artistic habit and make fine specimens. - 30-40' Tall

'Dr. Landis'- A fine Japanese white pine boasting intense, yellow and cream highlighted needles that rival the brightest of the group for spring and summer color. Plants are slower growing than the similar selection 'Goldilocks' and will develop a sculpted, spreading form in time. Average growth appears to be around 2-3" each year with plants obtaining an 3-4' framework over a 15 year period. - 6-8' Tall and Wide -

Pinus strobus - Eastern White Pine - Zone 3 - Full Sun - Eastern North America

An easygoing native of the eastern United States valued for use in large landscapes. The handsome soft needles are

blue-green in color and arranged in groups of five. Plants are easy to grow and display good vigor in full sun, well-drained locations. - 50-80' Tall

NEW 'Beal's Starry Night'- A mesmerizing Eastern white pine celebrated for its clustered needles that create a luminous, shimmering effect at branch end. The rounded, dwarf plants are refined in form and poised to become showpiece conifers for enthusiasts. This cultivar commemorates Professor Beal of Michigan State University, who planted the original specimen tree on which the original witches' broom was first discovered. - 2-3' Tall and Wide - #2 \$59.99

Taxus cuspidata - Japanese Yew - Zone 4 - Full Sun-Shade - Japan, Korea, Manchuria

A widely recognized medium-sized, vase-shaped evergreen tree or large, heavily branched shrub. The deep green needles align themselves in a flat, single plane along the green and reddish-brown stems. Older bark is maroon-red in color, peeling in long exfoliating shreds. Plants are both sun and shade tolerant performing admirably in many garden positions. The species is best known to gardeners by the numerous commercially available cultivars. - Irregular

'Rezek's Gold'- Golden new growth slowly adds layers of green as it matures into summer. Selected by plantsman and conifer enthusiast Ed Rezek of Long Island, this nugget of a plant is perfect for the front of borders or rockeries. - 3' Tall and Wide - #2 \$49.99

Thujaopsis dolobrata - Staghorn Cedar - Zone 5 - Full Sun-Part Shade - Japan

A unique monotypic genus native to southern Japan where it occurs in moist dense forests. The overall appearance is somewhat similar to an arborvitae but is generally slightly coarser in both texture and branch structure. Foliage is medium-green throughout the growing season taking on some bronze and orange hues in cooler weather. Best when grown in evenly moist, well-drained soil in full sun or bright shade. - 20-30' Tall

'Variegata'- A very rare form of staghorn cedar showcasing sprays of foliage that are boldly splashed and painted with shades of cream and white. Plants mature roughly half the size of the species forming large pyramidal shrubs in time. Some sheering helps maintain a full form. - 15' Tall - #2 \$49.99

Tsuga canadensis - Eastern Hemlock - Zone 3 - Full Sun-Shade - Eastern North America

A graceful tree native to eastern North America where it thrives in moist, well-drained, acidic soils. Plants are suited for many landscape situations and are surprisingly tolerant of shade. Sadly, the species is plagued by several insect and disease problems and requires routine maintenance to manage these pests. Despite these downfalls we carry several cultivars as we feel their beauty is well worth the time required to properly care for them. - 50-80' Tall

'Moon Frost'- An exciting dwarf hemlock with showy white new growth said to resemble the "glow of frost on a moonlit night". Plants are reliable growers performing best in part shade. As an added bonus the needles pick up attractive pink tones in winter. - 4' Tall, 6' Wide - #2 \$49.99

Deciduous Conifers

Ginkgo biloba - Ginkgo - Zone 4 - Full Sun - Eastern China

A prehistoric tree that has been on earth for more than 150 million years. Plants are widely recognized for their unique history and medicinal properties as well as their ornamental appeal. Over time, plants develop into massive specimens suitable for parks and large properties. The medium green, fan-shaped foliage is attractive all season and turns rich, butter-yellow in fall. Plants are rock hardy and adaptable to all but exceedingly wet soils. - 70' Tall

'Chase Manhattan'- A tiny treasure with diminutive, dark green leaves and a compact growth form. An ideal candidate for bonsai or the rock garden. - 6' Tall and Wide - #2 \$49.99

'Elmwood'- A fruitless male cultivar with a very narrow, strictly upright stature that offers much utility as a single specimen or when planted in a grove. Like all ginkgos, plants are urban tolerant and happily live in a diverse set of soil conditions including some of the more challenging scenarios out there. Plants provide the excellent vertical accent often necessary to form the backbone of well-designed spaces. - 30-40' Tall, 10' Wide - #2 \$49.99

'Gokusho-Ba'- Heavily veined half-sized leaves are congested on irregular, shrubby branching giving plants an architectural presence in the landscape. Our young plants seem to be somewhat upright in youth though indications suggest a more rounded framework will develop with age. We'll be the first to admit that we're still learning about this very rare and quite new introduction. - 6-8' Tall and Wide (Guess) - #2 \$49.99

NEW 'Jaded Jester'- A 2016 selection that was discovered as a chance variegated sport on a plant of 'Jagged Jade' by the keen eye of plantsman Crispin Silva. A colorful, slow-growing selection, it features heavily toothed foliage boldly streaked with yellow and set against a blue-green background. Among variegated ginkgos, this form appears to be at the top of the brightness scale and relatively stable, though occasional all-green reversions may occur. - 8-12' Tall and Wide (Guess) - #2 \$59.99

'Mariken'- A choice, dwarf form that was discovered as a witches' broom growing on a male plant of the species.

Specimens develop a tight, dense habit with closely spaced leaves. Leaves are slightly smaller than the species and have curious undulating margins. Makes an excellent rock garden plant or conversation piece that is sure to impress visitors. - 3' Tall and Wide - #2 \$49.99

'Robbie's Twist'- A bizarre form developing an irregular, upright habit with branches that arch and curve in ever manner imaginable. The medium green foliage is typical of the species but the stems have an unusual coat of fuzz. Certainly a different selection and no doubt a plant our collector friends will lust after. - 10' Tall, 5' Wide - #2 \$49.99

NEW 'Samurai'- A distinctive upright clone with oversized, bold, fan-shaped leaves. Plants develop a commanding, refined, architectural presence in the landscape. - 30-40' Tall, 15' Wide - #2 \$49.99 • #3 \$79.99

'Sari'- A charming, compact ginkgo that ranks among the smallest cultivars available. The slow growing plants are well mannered offering ancient character without overwhelming size. Its delicate, fan-shaped leaves provide subtle texture through the growing season. Come fall, it puts on a show with that unmistakable, glowing ginkgo gold! - 3' Tall and Wide - #2 \$59.99 • #3 \$89.99

'Snowcloud'- Hold on folks, here is a truly special ginkgo that promises to make quite a splash. The slow growing, compact plants owe their lack of vigor to the lack of chlorophyll they display in the foliage. Leaves emerge in spring shades of pale blonde before gradually becoming a cleaner shade of white with varied streaks of green throughout. Some leaves will be nearly completely white while others have larger amounts of green. Ultimate size and form is still unknown. - 12-15' Tall (Guess) - #2 \$59.99 • #3 \$89.99

Metasequoia glyptostroboides - Dawn Redwood - Zone 5 - Full Sun - Central China

An enchanting, upright, conical, deciduous conifer discovered in the wilds of China in 1941. The bright green foliage is attractive all season long and turns rich, amber-brown in fall. The bark is reddish-brown and deeply fissured on mature specimens. Plants are adaptable and will grow in both standing water and on dry sites. They also exhibit exceptional vigor and have few pest or disease problems. - 100' Tall

'Bonsai'- A cool, dwarf, arching form found as a chance seedling. Foliage has a slight bluish cast and transforms to bright yellow and rich bronze tones in autumn. Choice, beautiful and very rare! - 6' Tall and Wide - #2 \$49.99

NEW 'Hamlet's Broom'- 'Hamlet's Broom' is a rare dwarf selection of the prehistoric dawn redwood that averages 3-6" of growth annually. Spring's cream-flushed foliage transitions to fresh green tones during summer ahead of fall's classic amber tones. The congested plants are rounded when young, becoming more pyramidal with age. Mature size is still unknown though we expect 6-10' to be a reasonable estimate. - 6-10' tall - #2 \$49.99

'Head Hunter'- A semi-dwarf, congested form of dawn redwood that originated as a witches' broom. Plants are slow growers developing into rounded 4' shrubs over a 10 year period. Rare, choice and a whole new spin on this living fossil! - 6' Tall and Wide - #2 \$49.99

Taxodium distichum - Bald Cypress - Zone 6 - Full Sun - Southeastern North America

A well-known, deciduous conifer native to wet areas in the southeastern United States. In late spring, light green, fern-like, fine-textured leaves emerge from thin wiry stems. In autumn, the foliage turns rich orange-brown and provides a wonderful complement to the reddish-brown bark. Plants develop into majestic specimens and are adaptable to both wet and dry. In wet environments the roots will develop unique "cypress knees". - 50-80' Tall

NEW 'Cave Hill'- A unique dwarf selection of bald cypress distinguished by its dense, congested branching and compact growth habit. Its finely textured, soft green foliage forms tight, tufted sprays that create an appealing, sculptural look in the landscape. Unlike the full-size species, this diminutive form stays small and manageable, making it ideal for rock gardens, specialty conifer collections, or small spaces. The foliage transitions to warm bronze tones in autumn before shedding to reveal the interesting framework for winter. - 5' Tall and Wide (Guess) - #2 \$49.99

'Crazy Horse'- A very rare and unusual bald cypress with branches that twist and contort in an irregular fashion as the plant gains height. Foliage is rich green during the growing season and is contorted and clustered along the stems appearing more like a juvenile cedar than a bald cypress. Certainly unique among the deciduous conifers. - 12-15' Tall (Guess) - #2 \$49.99

NEW 'Hobbit'- A delightfully pint-sized bald cypress that skipped seconds and stayed small on purpose. This dwarf conifer offers soft, feathery green foliage that looks touchable enough to pet - go ahead, it won't judge. Unlike its towering relatives, 'Hobbit' behaves politely in smaller garden spaces, making it ideal for gardeners who fear the giant ambitions of the straight species! - 5' Tall and Wide (Guess) - #2 \$49.99

'Little Twister'- About as rare as a fish that can walk on land. This prized little bald cypress has been a standout in our extensive collection of Taxodium selections and finally, after about 8 years of efforts, we have sufficient stock to offer a few. These slow growers add about 2-3" of growth annually forming congested shrubs in time. Foliage is decidedly more delicate and thin than the norm and the branches have a distinct twist that lends plants a refined, individual texture. - 4' Tall and Wide - #2 \$49.99 • #3 \$89.99

NEW 'Secrest'- A compact clone of bald cypress with a dense, symmetrical, pyramidal habit. More restrained in size than the species, it features finely textured, bright green foliage that turns rich copper-bronze in fall before shedding. This selection originated as a witches' broom discovered at the Secrest Arboretum in Ohio. - 5' Tall and Wide (Guess) - #2 \$49.99 • #3 \$89.99

Shrubs

Aronia melanocarpa - Black Chokeberry - Zone 3 - Full Sun-Part Shade - Eastern North America

Black chokeberry is a worthwhile small deciduous shrub native to the eastern United States. The 1-3" long leaves are glossy dark green and transform to rich, crimson-red in fall. Abundant small white flowers appear in spring and are followed by respectable crops of large, purple-black fruits that persist for months. Plants are adaptable to many soil and light conditions and are suitable for use in many garden situations. - 4-6' Tall and Wide

NEW 'Nero'- Good things really do come in small packages, like this diminutive yet robust native. Clouds of white spring flowers give way to enormous clusters of glossy black fruit, perfect for jams, jellies, pies, or however you like to use them (if you can beat the birds to the harvest!). Fiery fall color rounds out a third season of beauty, all wrapped up in a mature size that fits neatly in any landscape. - 3-4' Tall and Wide - #2 \$39.99 • #3 \$49.99

Buddleja x 'Honeycomb' - Honeycomb Butterfly Bush - Zone 6 - Full Sun - Garden Hybrid

A reasonably long cultivated hybrid buddleja that has eluded our propagation list for far too long. The strong growing plants flirt with summer's sun with golden-yellow flowers that add a pleasant diversity to the color wheel of this genus. Silvery-green foliage complements the upright-arching framework and cheery flowers which often begin their show in early summer and continue through first frost. - 5-8' Tall - #2 \$39.99 • #3 \$49.99

Flower color ranges from near white to pale blue depending on soil pH though all will age through shades of antique pink mixed with green. As the foliage emerges in spring, plants display unique 1" purple flowers which develop into 3-5" kidney-shaped fruit. The fruit is edible and enjoyable with a taste that is a bit like a banana or banana-mango blend. The fruit is messy to eat fresh but is certainly worth experiencing. If fresh eating isn't your cup of tea, then maybe pawpaw gelato or pawpaw beer is more your style. Although plants are often capable of producing fruit on their own, production is generally dramatically increased by planting several clones in close proximity. In addition to fruit production, plants have a storied history of use. Apparently, the inner bark was once used to make fish nets! - 20-25' Tall

'Carillon' - A graceful, weeping selection of Japanese snowbell that will develop into a small stature, fountain-like tree over time. Develops a striking display of white flowers along the pendulous branches in May and June. Without a doubt one of the best weeping plants available and a form to be coveted by the plant savvy. Tilia cordata - Littleleaf Linden - Zone 3 - Full Sun - Europe

A deciduous medium-sized tree native to regions in Europe. Plants have long been in cultivation and are most valued for their formal pyramidal to conical habit and adaptability to difficult growing conditions. The heart-shaped leaves are deep green, free from disease and transition to shades of yellow and gold in autumn. Specimens are pollution tolerant, pH adaptable and easily cultivated in sunny locations in well-drained soils. - 40-50' Tall

'Winter Orange' - Wow, hold on to your lindens! This impressive plant sports glowing orange-ruby winter stems that stand out strikingly against the abundant somber tones of the dormant landscape. The well-built plants are strong growing with an ascending-formal framework in youth becoming more rounded with age. Best growth is likely to occur in a sheltered location with reasonably rich and free draining, evenly moist soils. Plants are truly beautiful and we are actively evaluating them for general garden performance in our region.
