Broadleaf Evergreens

Arctostaphylos uva-ursi Bearberry - Zone 3 - Full Sun-Part Shade - Northern Hemisphere

Bearberry is a wonderful, low growing evergreen groundcover native throughout much of North America. The foliage is lustrous dark green in summer and turns rich, reddish-bronze in fall and winter. In late summer and fall, plants are cloaked with an exceptional display of bright red, pea-sized fruit. Plants perform best in acidic sandy soils in full sun or partial shade. They also exhibit tremendous salt tolerance. - 1' Tall, 3' Wide

An abundance of small purple flowers provide an accent in spring followed by crops of red fruit in autumn on female plants when grown near male pollinators. This adorable, diminutive alpine shrub features tiny evergreen leaves and pea-like cream-to-yellow flowers spread over a low, dense mat in early spring. Performance will be best in cool and moist locations with well-drained soil in high, dappled shade, though the species will tolerate full sun as long as there's ample moisture available.
